Cleveland/Bradley Chamber Youth Leadership is a program of the Cleveland/Bradley Chamber of Commerce, with Bradley County and Cleveland City Schools and Tennessee Christian Preparatory School, that seeks to develop leaders who will have a positive impact on the growth and development of Cleveland/Bradley County.

Selection Criteria

Participation in Chamber Youth Leadership is open to students attending Bradley Central High School, Cleveland High School, Tennessee Christian Preparatory School and Walker Valley High School. A Selection Committee comprised of current and past Leadership Cleveland participants and based upon the information contained in this application will choose participants. The committee will seek representation from a cross-section of the student body. These leaders and potential leaders will be active in student clubs and organizations and will reflect the diversity of the student body.

Information

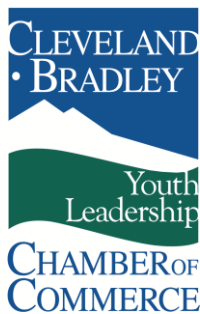
A group of 26 **rising** sophomores, juniors and seniors will be selected to join the Youth Leadership class, which will participate in a number of activities designed to help the students learn more about their city and county while practicing a variety of leadership skills. Students will attend a mandatory one-day retreat and six daylong sessions that will involve travel to a variety of sites in the county and a trip to Nashville to learn about state government.

Please consider your decision to apply seriously. Students will be expected to attend all activities and to involve themselves totally. Some outside work may be requested. The program requires a commitment from you and a corresponding commitment from your parent(s)/guardian(s). **Selection is an honor.** The Youth Leadership Committee will do everything possible to ensure this is a valuable and enjoyable experience for those involved.

Instructions

Consider the commitment. Then if you decide you would like to apply, you should do the following:

1. Have your parent/legal guardian read this information and sign the application.
2. **Complete application on computer (no handwritten applications will be accepted) and print application when completed.**
3. Remember when answering questions, originality counts.
4. Obtain two references from adults (other than family): **one person from school and one person outside of school.**
5. Submit all these materials no later than **3 p.m., Friday, March 1, 2019**, to your guidance counselor, and he/she will submit your current school transcript with your application.
6. **The mandatory retreat will be Tuesday, July 30, 2019.**
